### Walnut Valley Water District Presents ULFT Checks to Local High Schools

At their recent Board meeting, the members of the Walnut Valley Water District Board of Directors presented checks to Walnut, Diamond Bar, Rowland, and Diamond Ranch high schools for their participation in the District's Ultra-Low-Flush Toilet (ULFT) Distribution Program.

Four separate checks, each in the amount of \$3,125, were presented to Buddy Clements, Band Director and Corey Wicks, Associate Band Director, Walnut High School; Denis Paul, Principal and Rick Lorenzen, Band Director, Diamond Bar High School; Bill Weirich, Principal and Linda Hsieh, teacher, Rowland High School; and Monica Tourville, Principal and George Fullerton, Assistant Principal, Diamond Ranch High School.

All four schools have elected to earmark the funds received as a result of their participation in the ULFT Distribution Program to a selected campus organization at their respective high schools.

The Walnut Valley Water District sponsored the toilet distribution event earlier this year at the District's main office where 625 ULFTs were provided at no charge to District residential consumers. In light of the fact that a ULFT uses a mere 1.6 gallons of water per flush, the replacement of these low water using toilets will result in a savings of over 8 million gallons of water per year. At the distribution event, students from the high schools provided assistance with consumer registration and loading of the ULFTs into the consumers' vehicles. The participating high schools each received \$5.00 for every toilet installed, based upon the number of toilets returned for recycling.
