WALNUT VALLEY WATER DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTOR TAKES SEAT AS PRESIDENT

Walnut, CA (December 17, 2019) -On Monday, December 16, 2019, at Walnut Valley Water District's last Board meeting of the year, Director Theresa Lee assumed the position of Board President. This will be Director Lee's first term as WVWD Board President.

"It is a great honor to hold the position of Board President and I look forward to serving the District's community members, especially as we enter a new year and a new decade to make water conservation a way of life," said Board President Lee. "The District and its Board is dedicated to meeting the water supply needs of the communities we serve."

Director Lee represents WVWD's Division 3, which includes the community of South Diamond Bar. Lee is a long-time resident of Diamond Bar and was sworn in as a Director on January 19, 2016. Director Lee also serves as Commissioner and Chair of the Puente Basin Water Agency and is the District's Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) Region 8 Delegate.

Ms. Lee is the current owner of a customs brokerage company and is a member of the Foreign Trade Association and the National Customs Brokers & Forwarders Association of America. She is a graduate of the University of Southern California with a Bachelor's Degree in Biology and is an active community member and leader in several organizations such as the United Abacus Arithmetic Association (UAAA), the Chinese Institute of Engineers of Southern California (CIE-SoCal), the Diamond Bar Chinese American Association (DBCAA), and the Guitar Foundation of America.
